It's landscaping season, and there are a lot of landscaping materials in the roadway around the city. This is not only a storm water issue, but also a traffic safety hazard to have such material in the roadway. Pleasant View City spends time and money to keep the streets in compliance with federal and state storm water standards. Please help us keep sediment out of the storm water system.

Storm events and excess sprinkler runoff will carry sediment and other materials into the storm drain grates which creates problems within our system. Thank you in advance for your cooperation and compliance.
