That's why we would like to see more of you trained to help effectively. Organized help can do more good than random help. It will take 15 hours of your time, but it will be time well spent. The things you will learn are helpful in every day emergencies and invaluable when disaster strikes. We invite you to the class on Thursday, March 16th, where we will explain the program, show you why we need it, and teach you how to survive an earthquake. If we don't convince you that the training is worthwhile, don't come back. If you like it, and we think you will, come back on March 30th, April 13th, April 27th, and May 11th. You will learn about fire suppression, disaster medical triage and treatment, search and rescue and more. All classes begin at 6:30 P.M. in the basement of the City Office Building. NEW this year - Grades will be combined and 3rd grade will start player pitch

Boys Baseball - Grades 3rd-4th, 5th-6th, 7th-9th grades

Teams will be selected using the ***Mutual buddy request** system with half of one grade and half of the other grade. (ex. Half 3rd graders and half 4th graders)

Registration for PreK-2nd grade begins April 1st, and ends April 30th
(Register according to current grade)

T-ball - PreK-Kindergarten, must be 5 by September 1, 2017 or in Kindergarten

Coach Pitch - 1st-2nd grade

Resident registration is \$35.00 for PreK-2nd, t-shirt included
A \$10 Non-Resident fee will be added to the cost for all non-residents

Teams will be selected through the ***Mutual buddy requests** allow for each participant to request a friend to be on the same team, so long as that same friend requests the participant. For example, Joey requests Tommy during registration, and Tommy requests Joey. If the mutual buddies were paired during registration, then they are assigned to the same team. All other team member assignments are made by random placement.
