## Burn Permits

You can now apply for a burn permit from the Utah State Department of Environmental Quality.

There are three ways to complete the open burn permit application:

- Internet—The open burn permit application can be completed online. Completing this form online is the easiest and fastest way to complete the open burn permit application. An electronic copy of the application is automatically submitted to the county or municipal fire authority upon completion.
- Telephone—An applicant can call the DAQ at 801-536-4000 and complete the open burn permit application process over the phone. A DAQ inspector will ask the applicant for the required information and complete the application in just a few minutes.
- Mail—A hard copy of the application may be completed and submitted by mail to DAQ for electronic processing. To request a hard copy of the open burn permit application, contact DAQ by phone at 801-536-4000.

Note: It may take up to 14 days from the date of request to receive an open burn permit if a hard copy is submitted for processing.

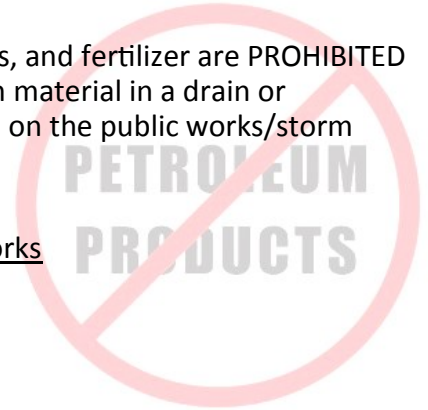

### Avoid Being a Victim

Better weather brings an increase in vehicle burglaries. Thefts from unattended vehicles usually occur during the night, and bad guys target cars where valuables are visible and lighting is limited. Most suspects aren't from Pleasant View, but come to our area because theft opportunities here appear more profitable. Many police reports taken from Pleasant View victims admit they always leave their car or houses unlocked because they think crimes of this type do not happen in Pleasant View. But, times are changing! Cars have even been broken into while residents were attending church.

The Pleasant View Police Department needs your help! Keep your garage door closed. Lock your vehicles while they are unattended. Use motion sensor or timed lights. Don't leave valuables in plain sight. How many of us lock our house but have a garage door remote in our unlocked car in the driveway? Remember you can use the car alarm button on your key fob as an alarm if you suspect someone in your house or garage. It's better to be smart and safe than sorry!
