LABOR DAY TRASH & RECYCLING DELAY


Due to the Labor Day holiday, trash and recycling services will be delayed by one day on the week of Monday, September 4th.

Pleasant View City will not be holding a Primary Election. (A Primary Election would be needed if we had more than double the candidates for the number of seats open).


Pleasant View City has (3) three City Council seats open with (5) five candidates running for those seats. The General Election will be held November 21st.
