Fee Schedule Changes to Utility Accounts

Pleasant View City Utility Customers will see an increase in their **Water, Garbage and Recycling** fees starting July 1st.

The average utility customers will see a **\$4.00 increase** in their monthly bill.

Garbage & Recycling Fees:

The increase in the garbage fees are due to the increase in landfill tipping fees and recycling tipping fees. Initially there were no recycling tipping fees charged to the City, but we are now being charged \$36.80 per ton. Also the tipping fees for regular garbage have increased from \$36.90 per ton to \$39.38 per ton. Consequently our monthly **garbage fee** of \$8.50 is increasing back to the **\$9.50** which was in place in 2014 and the \$2.25 monthly **recycling fee** is increasing to **\$3.00**.

If you have an **extra** Garbage Can or Recycling Can, those monthly fees are also increasing from \$9.50 to **\$10.50** and \$3.00 to **\$3.75** respectively.

If you are charged a **tipping fee only** (mainly private developments) those monthly fees are increasing from \$2.00 to **\$3.75**.

Water Fees:

Pleasant View City contracted with Zions Public Finance for a water rate study. At the conclusion of the study, a **\$2.25** monthly increase in the base water rate was proposed and the City Council accepted that proposal.

With the additional increase into the Water Fund the City will be able to continue the repair and replacement of existing infrastructure, continue the purchase of the additional water supply from Weber Basin Water Conservancy District, work on new capital projects and not have to bond for additional funding in the near future. This change will also keep the City's debt coverage ratios strong in case of an emergency.

A Reminder from the Storm Water Department

It's landscaping season and there are a lot of landscaping materials in the roadway around the city. This is not only a storm water issue, it's also a safety hazard to have such material in the roadway. Pleasant View City spends time and money to keep the streets in compliance with federal and state storm water standards.

Please help us keep sediment out of the storm water system. Although we haven't had much rain this year, sprinklers will carry the sediment materials into the storm drain grates which creates problems with our system.

Thank you in advance for your cooperation and compliance. Remember, We all live downstream!! Only rain in the drain!!

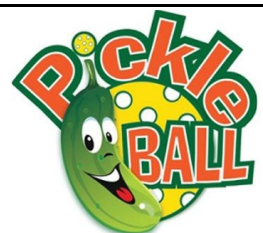

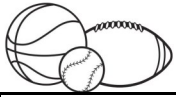
PICKLEBALL CLASSES—Group Learn-to-Play*
