All you need is an Internet connection through a Web browser and an e-mail address. Once you sign up for your free account and start using this service, you'll wonder how you ever got along without it!

It's simple to use. Every month we'll send you a reminder e-mail to let you know when your bill is online. Then you just log in to your account at XpressBillPay.com and view your bill. It's formatted like your paper statement so it will look familiar to you.

You can also see up to a full year's history of your account online, so you can compare your current bill to a year ago.

When you're ready to pay your bill, select a payment type. You can pay with credit card, debit card, or electronic funds transfer. Then enter the information and you're done! It's that easy, and it only takes you a few minutes each month.

T-ball – PreK-Kindergarten, must be 5 by September 1, 2017 or in Kindergarten


Coach Pitch - 1st-2nd grade

Pineview Water Systems Announcement

Pineview Water Systems which is composed of South Ogden Conservation District and Weber-Box Elder Conservation District, will begin charging its secondary water lines on April 10th of this year. The Districts will begin charging the systems five days earlier this season in order to identify leaks in the mains and get them repaired earlier than usual. This will help the Districts to deliver water to all of its customers in a timelier fashion.

When the Districts charge its water lines, water will be delivered to individual service lines. The District recommends that each personal master valve or main shutoff valve be closed prior to April 10th. The operation of each properties master valve is the responsibility of each property owner or occupant. When each property is ready for secondary water, the master valves should be opened. Each property should be inspected to ensure that no leaks are identified in the personal sprinkler systems. This should help ensure that no unnecessary property damage occurs. Local Pioneer Cabin Looking for Some Love

In 1880 William H. Hickenlooper, his wife Ann, and three sons left Salt Lake City where the family had lived since arriving in 1847 and moved to a 69-acre farm in Pleasant View. They were anxious to enjoy the rural life and be closer to other Hickenlooper relatives. They set up housekeeping in a small log house located just east of 1000 W at about 2900 N. The family soon built a larger 3-room adobe dwelling and the little log cabin became home to William and Ann's daughter Rachel and her husband Duncan McLane. The McLane's moved the cabin to the northeast corner of the property to make their home. The historic cabin remained at that location for decades until the recent development of the Jensen property. Neighbor Mike Humphreys,



knowing some of the cabin's history, carefully dismantled the logs and placed them in storage until a permanent home could be located. That is where the love comes in. Members of the City Council are seeking assistance to decide the next step. Is there a city park location that might be suitable for the cabin? How should the structure be properly restored and is the brief history complete and accurate? Questar Gas work along Pleasant View Drive

Questar Gas will begin construction on a gas line March 30, 2017 that will feed into a new regulator station in North Ogden. Regulator stations are facilities that reduce gas pressure to a level suitable for distribution to customers. This facility is necessary to help meet growing demand in Pleasant View and North Ogden cities, and ensure reliable service for existing customers. The project will begin at the Park-n-Ride at the intersection of US-89 and Pleasant View Drive in Pleasant View City, and continue eastward along Pleasant View Drive to Lomond View Drive. At Lomond View Drive, the pipeline will head east to the regulator station site at 165 E Lomond View Drive. Construction is anticipated to last through the end of September 2017. While Questar Gas and its contractor, Tempest Enterprises, hope to minimize negative impact on residents and businesses along the corridor, issues may arise.
