Mayor's Message

Thank you to everyone who came out and enjoyed Founder's Day. It was a great success! The Parade was great and seems to be getting bigger each year. Woody did a great job on the Car Show, which seemed to be twice as big as last year with double the people. The new water slide in the park was a hit for the kids. This activity was paid for by Western Skies Argo (soon to be a new dealership in Pleasant View) - Rex Whitaker, and Dean Stokes. A big thanks to the Hales Family for providing the entertainment at the Salmon Bake and the Christensen Family who does a wonderful job cooking!

I would also like to thank all of the volunteers who helped throughout the day and served at the Salmon Bake. Also, without the help of our City crew and staff we couldn't pull off such a successful day. Thanks for stepping up!

Now on to business. Tempest is now almost out of our City on the East side of Pleasant View Dr. Thank you for being patient during this process.

Soon you will see several more road projects started. First is the maintenance of our roads focusing mostly up on the hill this year, to the tune of over \$488,000.00 along with the road construction on 4300 N. from 500 W. going East in front of the new Fire Station. Just when you thought the road work was done on Pleasant View Dr, think again. At about Evergreen Dr. and just West of 1100 W, crews will be working to bypass the existing storm sewer system to allow us to take the water out to our basin just West of Highway 89.

When was the last time we talked about water? As I have mentioned, the infrastructure for the additional water source is in ground and Ormond Construction is on site where we purchased the property off 2550 N, and are currently working on the construction of the pump house.

The City Budget for 2017-2018 has been approved with a few significant changes. We will be adding an additional Police Officer to the force for better coverage and officer safety. The draw back is that this will cause a tax increase of approximately 12% on your property tax bill. The Truth and Taxation information has been posted on the City website.


We have a new restaurant in Pleasant View!
