Please know that we at the City are staying in close contact with as many sources as we can possibly monitor; Federal, State, Weber County, Weber/Morgan Health Department, Local Hospitals, Emergency Services, Mental Health, Schools and other Cities. As you all know, this is a very fluid and rapidly changing situation that we are facing. I'm both humbled and proud of the way that I have seen our community respond to this pandemic. Once the pre-filled bag supply is depleted, you will need to fill your own bags using the supplies provided.

Now that Winter has relinquished its hold on us and meter lids are free of snow, your bill now reflects your actual meter reading. Over the winter months, the meters are estimated by a computer. Once the meters are read again in the Spring, your bill reflects the actual water usage during the time of estimation and any corrections from over or under estimates will work themselves out.

### Important Sewer Reminder

To help us keep our Sewer Systems as well as your in home plumbing functioning properly and to avoid costly damage from clogged pipes, please remember the only thing that you should flush is waste and toilet paper. Though wipes and paper towels seem similar to toilet paper they can swell and create blockages as they do not break down the same and should never be flushed.
