June Primary Election Update: Stay Safe – Vote from home – Vote By Mail

Because of COVID-19, state law requires that the June Primary Election be conducted entirely by mail. Weber County plans to provide emergency-only in-person voting services to voters who need accommodations due to a disability or problems with their ballot.

If you do not belong to the Republican or Democratic party, we will not mail you a ballot unless you contact us.

How can you make sure your vote is counted?

Verify/Update your information ASAP. Go to www.vote.utah.gov to verify and update your address and party affiliation. All changes must be made by June 19th.

Return your ballot by mail or by secure drop box (located at your city hall or county library). Don't forget to wear your "I Voted" sticker – it's included with your ballot!



Curbside Recycling Program

Always Recycle

Only these items can be added to your recycling bin. Anything other than the items listed are considered residue. Recyclables must be loose, never wrapped in plastic bags. Any food waste residue or liquids remaining in containers will contaminate the recyclables and will deem them debris.

- Cardboard
- Paperboard – cereal boxes, shoe boxes
- Paper - office paper, newsprint, **NO SHREDDED PAPER**
- Plastics 1 and 2
 - PETE #1- soda, water and some other beverage bottles
 - HDPE Natural #2- Milk Jugs
 - HDPE Colored #2- Laundry Jugs
- Aluminum and Tin cans.

Do NOT Include These Items

- NO Plastic bags or plastic film of any kind, including grocery sacks, pet food bags, bread bags.
- NO Plastics #3-7
- NO Juice or Beverage Paper Cartons
- NO Food Waste
- NO Glass
- NO Disposable Diapers- YUCK!
- NO Medical Waste or Needles
- NO Grass, Green Waste, Wood
- NO Foam Cups or Containers
- NO Clothes or Shoes
- NO Children's Toys, Laundry Baskets or Large Plastic Items
- NO Batteries
- NO Dead Animals

Step 1: Register your display!

Step 2: Decorate Your Porch

- Be creative and go wild with your own ideas to decorate your porch in a fun family friendly way. The point of decorating is to unleash your creativity and inspire hope for your friends and neighbors.
- Porches must be fully decorated by 12 noon on Monday, June 22, and able to stay up until midnight Saturday, June 27.
- Porches must be appropriate for a family friendly audience.

Porch categories and definitions:

Stoop/Small Porch = Stair(s) with a small landing, usually about as wide as your steps, that leads into your entrance.

Medium Porch = A porch that extends on 1-side of the entrance, spanning half the entrance face of your home.

Large Porch = A porch extending on both sides of the entrance, spanning nearly the entrance face of your home.

Rules & Regulations:

- Displays should not focus on religious, political, ideological, or controversial themes or issues. Use of any political sign, social or political material is not permitted.
- Displays are not a place for commercial marketing. Businesses are welcomed and encouraged to participate with a focus on the mission of bringing community together while staying home.
- Founder's Day committee reserves the right to exclude any displays from the porch parade map that do not meet our guidelines.
- Porch Parade Map showcasing Pleasant View displays will be available on the Pleasant View City website - www.pleasantviewcity.com beginning Tuesday, June 23.
- Awards will be given in each category: Stoop/Small Porch, Medium Porch and Large Porch.
