the gutter? <u>Jaxon Kern</u>: it goes to the backyard. <u>Mayor Call</u>: there are EPA rules. <u>Tyson Jackson</u>: we need time to vet this out. Some need oil separators and it may increase municipal services with an increase of culinary water use. <u>Mayor Call</u>: we need to make sure with our stormwater people and vet this with staff. <u>Amy Mabey</u>: the council could approve just the interior detailing without the exterior washing. <u>CM Marriott</u>: how often and how many vehicles? <u>Jaxon Kern</u>: a maximum of three a week but only one car in a day. <u>CM Marriott</u>: I would go forward with the license. <u>CM Gibson</u>: I support CM Marriott's idea as long as it is not creating a nuisance for the neighbors, noises, junk. I worry about pollution.
