Laurie Hellstrom reviewed the resolution with the council. Amy Mabey: there is a retainage and bonus for the PWD in the budget. We can't lose any more employees. It is \$9,500, \$1k for fulltime and \$500 for parttime PWD employees. It will be a lump sum. We are currently working to redefine and have a work chart and try to create a solution. This is not only happening in our city and also with the police. With the city's growth we are understaffed. CM Bailey: this is only for the PWD? Amy Mabey: yes.

CM Urry: a few of us attended the RAMP training. I am on the Parks and Recreation RAMP Committee. Santa and pictures will happen December 11th.

CM Marriott: thanks Tyson. It is hard to go without staff - work on that. There is a lot of information to understand with fiber.

Mayor Call: we have a meeting with North Ogden to talk fiber and we want to see where they are at. The Skyline Drive project will need help from State and Federal monies to help with the \$50M project. Pleasant View can't carry that burden. The city council will have a Christmas party December 10th. We will add a work session for fiber on November 16th.
